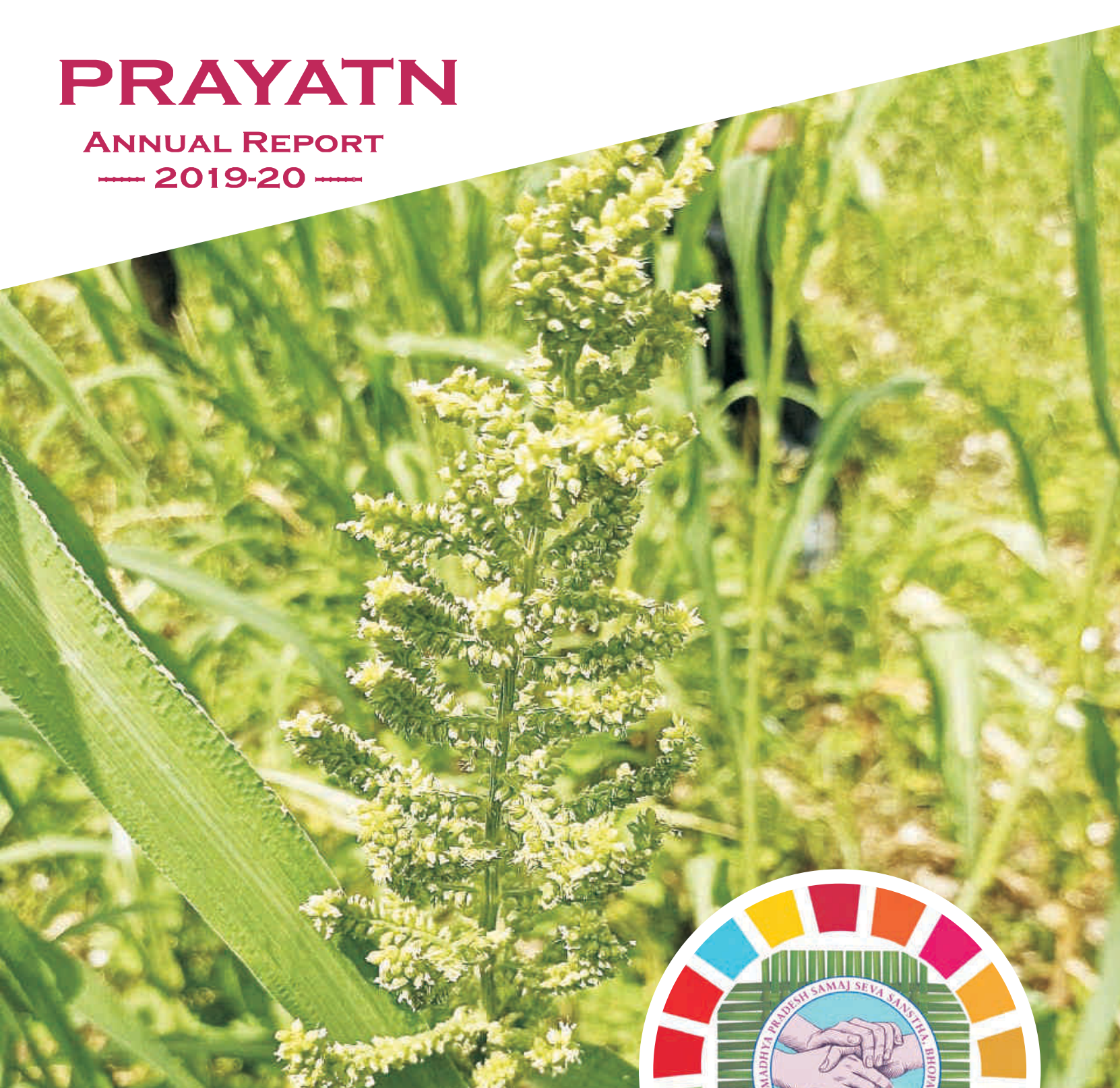

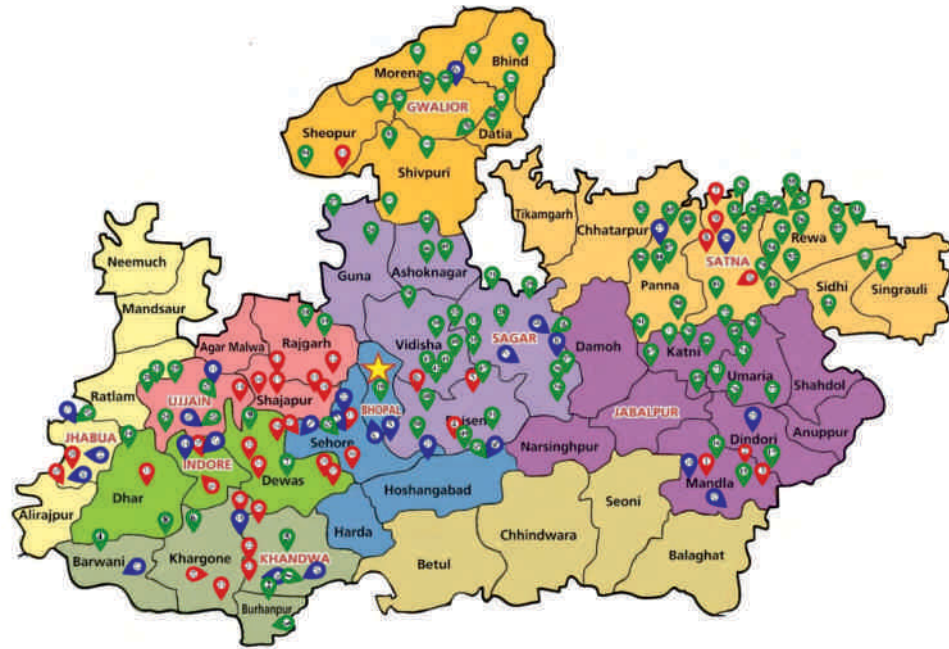

Half yearly review meeting was held on 1st April 2019 at MPSSS Bhopal. Fr.Kiran Olakkengil, Director, MPSSS, Assistant Program Manager, CHAI, Community Health Coordinator's and Regional Program Officer, Mr.Balendra Singh Kaurav were part of the meeting. Objective of the meeting was to have discussion on last six months activities and where we are now and finally discussion was held on next six month plan. Various achievements and challenges being shared by the CHCs and discussed for better improvements in future.



People pledge for protection of Mother Earth



World Earth day was observed by MPSSS through its 9 Partner's of Madhya Pradesh on 26th April 2019. Different activities were organized to celebrate the day. The purpose of celebrating Earth Day was discussed with the community members i.e. to help to keep our grass green and our skies blue with more trees plantation and less pollution. Activities like trees plantation, rallies, interactions etc. were held during the day.

Learning & Exchange visit to Social Service Centre, Shillong

3 days exposure visit was organized by MPSSS for the staffs of the Partner's from 12th to 14th June 2019. 30 participants from 9 Partner's were part of the visit. The objective of the visit was to gain knowledge on-: Traditional Agricultural Practices for food sovereignty, Farmers Market and Interaction with the Farmers on Nutrition and Agriculture.



Brainstorming session on community health



On 2nd May 2019 St. Marys Socio Awareness Centre visit was undertaken by Fr. Kiran and Balendra Singh Kaurav-Regional Program Officer, MPSSS. Objective of the visit was to orient the health workers on community health. Fr. Kiran Addressed on the roles and responsibilities of a community health volunteer's, stake holders and target groups. Another session emphasised on Factors affecting the health of community which was conducted by Mr.Balendra Singh.



RLEP change facilitators in motion

Vth Regional Learning and Exchange Platform (RLEP) workshop from 3rd to 11th July 2019 was held at Maumere, Indonesia for Facilitating Change Processes towards Food Sovereignty in South Asia. Objective of the workshop was to “Deepen understanding of actions for change and how these are resisting the political forces that challenge us, towards strengthening peoples' movements for food sovereignty.



Partner Accompaniment for Quality Assurance



Organization development visit was undertaken among 3 Partner's from July to September 2019 namely Pragati MVSS and ANWC. Ms. Mamta Jacob-Regional Program Officer, MPSSS interacted with the staffs of the organizations. Discussions were held on various policies implemented by the organizations, organizations interaction with the communities and how do they look at development and changes, health issues of adolescents, reporting and documenting the results of the field level and linkages with the Government departments etc.

Gender Mainstreaming is inclusive

Regional Program Officer Ms.Mamta Jacob actively participated in the workshop at Himachal Pradesh from 08-11 July 2019. Workshop showcases a set of themes, topics and activities that can be used to engage boys in a structured gender-transformative programme. Key concepts like gender, sexuality, Gender Based Violence, and human rights were covered in the training through the mediums of interactive discussions, conversations, role-plays, videos and group activities. Participants were engaged with the themes of gender and specifically, how to equip adolescent boys to identify, challenge and change inequitable gender norms in the society.



Capacity Enhancement on Health & Hygiene



One day capacity building training was organized for the staffs of KDSS, Khandwa on 2nd September 2019. Objective of the training was to develop skills of Staff on adolescent girl' health and hygiene issues. Topics covered were menstrual hygiene, Personal health care, handling queries of adolescent girls and Nutritional requirements among the adolescent girls. 14 staffs was part of the training.



Gender Mainstreaming essential key to community development

An activity and dialogue based workshop was organized by MPSSS for three days from 29th to 31st August 2019. Workshop helped the participants from 9 Partner's to develop and to understand how gender roles and thoughts are the causes of imbalances and why we are not able to see and sense them as root causes of existing social problems. Lastly process of proposal development took place.



St Joseph Hostel Inaugurated

On 6th of July 2019 St. Joseph hostel was inaugurated by Archbishop Leo Cornelio SVD. Well-wishers far & near along with MPSSS team were part of the inauguration function.

Session held on Micro-planning

One day orientation of PLDP staffs was held on micro planning at IDSSS, Indore on 3rd October 2019. Some of the highlights of the trainings were:- What is micro-planning, PRA methods importance, Role of micro-planning in the development of village, PRA method resources mapping, social mapping, wealth ranking, malnutrition mapping etc. Session was conducted by Mr. Maria Michael- Regional Program Officer, MPSSS.

Orientation for the New Staffs

Two days orientation was conducted by Mr. Maria Michael- Regional Program Officer for the ANWC newly appointed PLDP Coordinator & new West Zonal Coordinator. Both were oriented on PLDP (Peoples led development process) concepts and their roles and responsibilities.

Organic Farming a key to end Malnutrition

Two days capacity enhancement program was organized for 46 community facilitators from 7 Partner's on Organic farming. The training was held at Kripa training centre at Ujjain from 11th to 12th October 2019. Mr. Maria Michael & Ms. Natasha Sharma -Regional Program Officers from MPSSS oriented the staffs on organic agricultural methods and practices as a means to address the issue of malnutrition.





Forum Directors Meeting Held at Sikkim

The forum Directors came to West Bengal to discuss about the Child related issues in the Country. West Bengal Forum is taking a lead role in addressing the Children issues. All the Forum Directors took the blessings and intercession of Saint Mother Theresa of Calcutta to stand firm in the development sector.

International Women's day celebrated

International Women's Day was observed by MPSSS with its staff on 8th March to celebrate social economic, cultural and political achievements of women. Female staff were honoured on this auspicious day with best wishes and a bouquet of flowers.



Forum Director's Meet

Forum Director's meeting was held at Coimbatore from 13th to 19th January. Representing Madhya Preadesh Forum Fr.Kiran-Director MPSSS participated in the event. They collectively thought how to take initiatives to the local level.



National Peace Conference

Sixth National Peace Conference, organized by National Peace Movement was held at Bangalore in Christ University from 30th January to 1st February 2020. MPSSS Director, Fr.Kiran participated in the same. During the three days of conference participants reflected and discussed on various dimensions of "Peace making in the present Indian context". Other Participants also include renowned speakers, Social Activist, Educationist, Authors, Journalists, Professionals and Young Students.

Kisannotsav held at Bhopal

Kisannotsav was held for two days from 3rd to 4th March 2020. The Conference was organized by Caritas India in Collaboration with MPSSS and Welt Hunger Hilife. Organic seed fare and food fare stalls were displayed which was inaugurated by His Excellency Bp.Gerald Almeida -the Regional Chairman of Social Forum. The pan India Conference was attended by more than 300 farmers representing various farmer organizations from 17 States of India. Mutual sharing of experience and knowledge through panel discussions was one of the highlights of the event. Farmers from across the country also actively participated in cultural programs.



Plan of action for COVID-19 relief activities

Regional Forum Directors, CBCI (Catholic Bishop's Conference of India) Commissions and CRS (Catholic Relief Services) came on a common platform to work together as one family to face the outbreak of Covid-19 which has become Pandemic and an international concern posing a significant challenge. Fr.Kiran-



from MP region participated in the meeting and discussions. Caritas India had organized this meeting to take stock of the COVID-19 outbreak and to come up with National Plan of Action on 19th March 2020 at Caritas India Head Office, New Delhi. The reflections during the stock taking meeting with various regional representatives highlighted the situation of the pandemic and the efforts taken up by the church and various faith-based organizations across the country.

Disha Meeting

Disha was organized at MPSSS office, Bhopal. All the Partner's-Directors were part of the meeting from 23rd to 24th January, 2020. The objective of the meeting was to finalize the strategic plans for the year. Dr. Mr. Saju-Zonal Manager of CARITAS facilitated the directors on first day. Second day planning for the Lantern campaign and farmers exchange was done by Forum Director.



Welcoming the new Director of Samaritan, Satna

Fr. Justin was newly appointed as the Director of Samaritan Social Service Society, Satna, replacing Fr. Rony. During the DISHA meeting, Fr. Kiran introduced him to the panel and welcomed the new Director with a flower bouquet.



Organizational Development Visit

Regional Program Officer Mr. Christopher undertook visits to ANWC, Bhopal and Samaritan, Satna on 8th February and 18th March 2020 respectively to understand the organizational culture and support them in the process of organizational development. All the key employees along with Directors joined the meeting.

Peer Learning and Farmer's Exchange

Farmers Exposure visit was organized for two consecutive days on 26th & 27th February 2020 at Meghnagar, Jhabua. 43 participants including Farmers, Coordinators and Facilitators from 9 Partner's were part of the program. Field visits to 4 villages were organized for the farmers to have exposure to the small millets farming developed by the farmers of Meghnagar. Interaction and discussions were held among the farmers on the millet cultivation, its process, importance of its nutrition and the appropriate season for the same. Farmers representing different Partner's also brought the seeds and medicinal herbs they cultivate in their respective villages for mutual sharing of the information.



RLEP Change facilitators shared experiences for mutual learning

Workshop of two days was organized for the 62 Facilitator's from 9 Partner's. The objective of the workshop was to have orientation by the change facilitator's of RLEP on food sovereignty. Principles to be followed for food sovereignty, preparations of organic manure, practicing of mixed cropping, importance of having kitchen garden were some of the points of discussed in the training.



Board Member interaction with MPSSS team

Team of MPSSS got an opportunity to have interaction with the Board Members. Most. Rev. Bp. Gerald Almeida, Chairman, MPSSS, Fr.Kiran-Director MPSSS, Fr.Alexander Jesudasan, Dr. Saju M.K and Mr. Shaji Chacko were part of the meeting. Achievements and challenges of the various projects undertaken by MPSSS were shared by the core Program team.



Staff Meetings held to refined the works

Regular staffs meetings were held every month under the leadership of MPSSS Director Fr.Kiran Olakkengil. All staff members participate in the meeting. The progress of the work done and plan of action ahead are shared during the meetings by the team members.

MPSSS Staff Reflection and Planning Meeting

One day MPSSS staff reflection was held on 4th January 2020 at Goharganj in Raisen, Block. Reflection and planning meeting for staffs is very much meaningful and productive as it helped the staff to have peer learning's from each other. It also helps to plan and set goals and objective together for the upcoming periods. Later the day was spent in forest which was much enriching and joyful for all the team members.



Capacity Enhancement by MPSSS staffs team



As a part of staff refining a series of sessions were organized by the team members of MPSSS. Topics covered under various sessions which were held through out year were Cancer prevention, Alternative use of Plastic, Nutrition & Kitchen Garden, Children Parliament, Alternative sources of Energy etc. In one of the session on cancer prevention BSSS students also participated.

Campaign to Cut the Chain but Care the Needy

Campaign Cut the Chain but Care the Needy was launched by MPSSS in the region on 21st March 2020. Motive behind the campaign was to create awareness among the community on fighting against the Covid-19 Pandemic along with care the needy people with basic amenities.



Initiate and Assist Partners at all Levels of Project Cycle Management (PCM) for Thematic Development

Community Interaction and Exchange of Ideas



Accompaniment visits were held from April to June among PLD Partners. Visits were undertaken at ANWC, Bhopal, Kripa, Ujjain, MVSS, Sagar, JDSSS, Jabalpur and GCSS, Gwalior. Objective of the visit was to visit the People Led Development Process implementation area & monitor the progress of the project & its impact on the community and to interact with the staff. The performance appraisal of the team and work too was done during the visits. Visits being carried out by Mr. Michael and Natasha Sharma-Regional Program Officers, MPSSS Bhopal.

Member Institutions mapping undertaken at various districts on M.P.

Three days MI mapping visit was from 15th to 17th May 2019 held at Guna, Ichaawar and Bankhedi respectively. During the visit information taken about the member institutions and documented in a prescribed format. Discussion was held with the members on available health schemes of the Government. Similarly 21 MIs mapping of Mandla district was undertaken from 27th to 30th May 2019. Interaction was done with the institutions and data was collected for documentation on 29th to 30th April 2019. Discussion were held on various Government Schemes.



Re-orientation on Flip chart usage

5 days visit to community health Member Institutions of Chhattisgarh was done by Balendra Singh Kaurav Regional Program Officer-MPSSS from 4th to 8th May 2019. Orientation provided to the participants on Special village level activities to be conducted and wall paintings to be carried out on WASH theme.



Accompaniment visit to Samaritan, Satna



Visit was undertaken at Satna for 2 days in 4 villages from 14th to 15th May 2019 by Ms.Natasha-Program Officer, MPSSS. Interaction took place with the community people in which they shared about the work they were doing. Kitchen garden that was made by the community was a highlighting point that was visited. Interaction also took place with the Director, Coordinator and the

facilitators. Feedback being provided for future improvement of work.

People Led Development Process Further Enhanced

8 Partner's were accompanied during the field visits undertaken by Mr. Michael & Ms.Natasha-Regional Program Officers, MPSSS during the months July to September 2019.

Total 18 villages were visited during the visits. The Partner's visited are ANWC, GCSS, KDSS, Pragati, Samarita, and IDSSS. Objectives of the visits was to have observe the progress of the work. Some of the points of discussion were organic farming done



by the communities, voluntary action taken, kitchen garden,

malnutrition status, tree plantation etc. During the visits Orientations were also provided to the staffs of Partner's on PLDP concepts, Land Rights, malnutrition issue, further importance of Anganwadi and its facilities by Michael.

Capacity Enhancement to DSSS staff on PLDP concepts

Two days orientation was done by Mr. Maria Michael- Program Officer to the IDSSS new PLDP Coordinator Ms. Serena Joseph on 9 & 10 September 2019 at MPSSS. Topics covered under orientation were concepts of PLDP, Forest Right Act, Anganwadi services, Food security and food Sovereignty.

Community Health Volunteers & Coordinators were accompanied



Member Institutions of Chhattisgarh were visited from 21st to 27th. Objective of the visit was to meet to Community Health Volunteers & Community Health Coordinators. Discussion was held on village Health plan, external evaluation, impact of wall painting, Special village level activities, use of Flip book, Income Generation Programme & Social Security Scheme, project progress. Visits involve visiting of intervention area and have meeting with community members and Conducting MI Mapping at Bilaspur and Rajnandgaon District of CG.

Mutual Learning Helps

Three days exposure visit by NavJeevan Bal Bhavan team from Vijaywada was held at Sagar from 5th to 7th August 2019. Interaction was held with the communities on income generation activities, Government schemes etc. The whole visit was organized and coordinated in supervision of Mr. Balendra Singh-Regional Program Officer-MPSSS, Bhopal.



Member Institutions of Madhya Pradesh were visited

14 Member Institutions of Madhya Pradesh was visited during the months July to Sep, 2019 by Mr. Balendra Singh Kaurav-Regional Program Officer, MPSSS under community health program. Districts covered were Khandwa, Barwani, Dhar, Indore, Dindori and Satna. The purpose of the visit was to meet the Directors/Administrations/



Manager and to introduce various Government schemes and discuss on same under the Public Private Partnership program.



Awareness on Government Health Schemes

Administrators & In charge of the health Centres were met during the visits of Chhattisgarh & MP regions. A total of 15 health centres were visited from October to December 2019. Interactions were held on various schemes like Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme, National Rural Health



Mission, National Blindness Control Programme (NBCP) and Prevention of Parents to Child Transmission (PPTCT)/ Integrated Counseling and Testing Center (ICTC) scheme for hospitals under PPP schemes that can be availed through Government. Visit also involves meeting with the Govt. departments like Social Justice and Chhattisgarh State Aids Control Society (CGSACS) at Raipur and their State Officers about Public Private Partnership (PPP) scheme for MIs. Visit involves discussion with the volunteers on progress of work analyzing their achievements along with the & challenges of work.

Enhancing Cancer-Care at Gwalior Member Institutions



Gwalior MI was visited on 4th November 2019. Objective of the visit was to have discussion with Sisters In charge on Cancer schemes and Palliative care that improves the quality of life of patients and their families facing the problem associated with the life-threatening illness. Discussions emphasized the prevention and relief of suffering by means of early identification and flawless assessment and treatment of pain and other problems associated with cancer treatment.

Close Accompaniment with three partners of MP region were ensured for sustainable actions

Executive Directors along with three MP partners have participated in Strategic Planning and Catholic Social Teachings piloting meeting at Caritas Delhi. The meeting with the twenty five selected partners from North India Regions was held at Caritas India office in Delhi on October 7th, 2019. Twenty five Diocesan Directors and five Regional Forum Directors participated. The purpose of this meeting was to establish clarity and consensus on the closer accompaniment for implementation of Strategic Plan and CST in the coming years.



Partners oriented on traditional farming



Kripa, Pragati & MVSS were accompanied at the fields in the month of October 2019. The major objective of the visits was to discuss on old traditional practices of farming which was shared by the Elders of the village in which they shared that earlier there were no chemicals available, only cow dung was the source of manure which they used as the only natural

fertilizers in their field. Other points of discussion were importance of kitchen garden, Anganwadi services and addressing of malnutrition issue.



Accompaniment visits



Month of November 2019 visits were undertaken at Kripa-Ujjain, Samaritan-Satna, JDSSS-Jabalpur & KDSS-Khandwa spending two days at each centre. Total 8 villages were visited. Visits were done by Mr. Maria Michael -Regional Program

Officer & Natasha Sharma- Regional Program Officer, MPSSS Bhopal. Points of discussion were proper implementation of Anganwadis, impact of organic farming & kitchen gardens, promotion of traditional millets and forest produces and its benefits.

Ganga Ma Mandal Model introduced in the field



Visit was conducted at IDSSS & ANWC in December 2019. Orientation and practical session was provided to the farmers on technical aspects of constructing the Ganga Ma Mandal structure at IDSSS Indore. Ganga Ma Mandal which was initiated at the field level its importance

was shared with the communities. The discussions also focused on organic farming, usage of forest produces and importance of kitchen garden which will have larger impact in reducing malnutrition.



Promoting Personal and Social Responsibility among the Children

PROCEEDINGS

Introductory Prayer, Welcome and Roll Call:

The meeting convened according to the rules & regulations of the Registered Societies Act, started with prayer by Bishop Gerald Almeda, the President of MPSSS and welcomed all the participants. The roll call was done and the Members registered the names and other details.

Presentation and approval of the Agenda for the AGBM:

Fr. Kiran Olakkengil, Secretary and Treasurer MPSSS, presented the agenda of the meeting. The agenda was approved with general consensus of the floor with the understanding that matters coming up can be taken up under 'Any Other Topic'.

Presentation of the Minutes of the 21st AGBM:

Fr. Kiran Olakkengil, Secretary and Treasurer, MPSSS presented the minutes of the previous AGBM. After the presentation of the minutes, the President invited clarifications, suggestions and modifications if any. As there were no more clarifications asked and modifications demanded. Thus, Fr. George proposed and Fr. Rony second the minutes to be passed.

Presentation of the Annual Activity Report 2018-2019:

The Chairmen Bp. Gerald Almeida unveiled the annual magazine of MPSSS, The Executive Director distributed “Prayatn –The annual report of MPSSS”.

He also presented the activity report for the year 2018-2019. After the presentation Bishop Rev. Gerald Almeda appreciated positive outcomes of PLD program. He emphasized that Misereor is one of the credible international supporter of our activities. Therefore all of us need to perform all the activities with utmost commitment and dedication. Fr. Mukesh enquired about outcomes of other programs as well. Fr. Kiran explained details of community Health program supported by CHAI given on page no.17 with details about MOUs signed, Applications submitted and consent letters submitted with various government departments. He further added activities that took place under organization development program supported by Caritas, he said appointment of assistant director has taken place after the second line leadership training; policies are tracked to ensure accessibility and availability along with documentation support.

Fr. Alexander asked about number of catholic families supported or benefitted by the organisation's social work activities. Fr. George responded that we work with entire communities and vulnerable population if those families fall under such criteria we support them but as separate catholic members they cannot be supported.



Fr. Peter also added that we work with universal coverage, catholic families cannot be specified.



Bishop Gerald added that working exclusively for some particular group is not the target of social work organisations. We need to work together to achieve greater goals of the organisation. He also suggested that it is a great idea to start nursing schools with all the partners, this gives assured jobs and respectable positions for women in community.

President asked the floor for further clarifications if any, As there were no further clarification demanded, the report was proposed to pass by Fr. Sunil George and was seconded by Fr. Peter Katara.

Presentation of the Audit Statement for the year 2018 – 2019:

Fr. Kiran Olakkengil, Secretary and Treasurer, presented the audited statement for the financial year 2018-2019. The President asked all the participants to go through the statements of accounts circulated and raise concerns if any.

As there were no clarifications demanded, the report was proposed to pass by Fr. Alexander and was seconded by Sr. Ancy.

Presentation of the Annual Budget for the year 2019 - 2020:

The annual budget for the year 2019-20 was presented by Fr. Kiran. The President asked all to go through the Annual Budget and to share the modifications and clarifications if any.

Fr. Sunil George asked about the income forecast under the use of infrastructure, on this Fr. Kiran said that the hall charges and payments received for the usages of building is booked as income from infrastructure, this income is separate from hostel's income.

Bishop Gerald Almeida added that we should think about the future and sustainability of MPSSS. We need to create a corpus through various possibilities. MPSSS main office building must be wisely used to generate a minimum income. We also need to think about the expanding the hostel as this income can sustain the office and its maintenance at MPSSS. The budget was proposed by Fr. Mukesh and was seconded by Fr. Mariya Stephan.

Appointment of the Auditor for the year 2018–2019:

The President asked whether the MPSSS team is happy with the present Auditor or not. Fr. Kiran responded saying that the MPSSS team is happy with the present Auditor as he is strict with FCRA, Financial Policy and the rules and regulations of the Government and completes the work in time. Bishop Gerald Almeida said that all the auditors have to be strict as they cannot afford to make mistakes. Thus the decision was taken unanimously to continue with the same Auditor for next financial year.

The decision was proposed to pass by Fr. Alexander and seconded by Fr. Martin.

Election for the Vacant Board Member:

Fr. Kiran informed that three posts are vacant and we need elections for the same.

1. Fr. Jonedius Toppo who was the Director of ANWC and was also the Zonal Director, he is transferred and Mr. Shaji Chacko has joined ANWC as the Coordinating Officer. Bishop Gerald said as per bylaws of MPSSS only the Director of partner organization can be member of board since Mr. Shaji Chacko is not appointed as Director, He cannot be elected as the Zonal Director and as Board member. President asked Fr. Kiran to check with society lawyer and consult Arch Bishop on this matter. Therefore the post continues to be vacant in the Board.

2. Dr. Jaya Peter has informed that she has been given extra responsibilities at her workplace and will not be able to give sufficient time as GBM member hence we need to look for her substitute. More than three board meetings She was also absent. Therefore new women representatives need to be found. Dr. Sheeba who works with quality assurance department of BSSS College was a special invitee to the AGBM and took part in AGBM. The request from Dr. Sheeba for the membership of MPSSS was reviewed by the Governing Board and granted individual Membership. She was unanimously elected as the woman representative to the Governing Body of MPSSS.

3. Mr. K.A. Sebastian “State Officer” Caritas India has been transferred from Bhopal, hence Mr. Saju M.K Zonal Manager, Caritas India will be the representative from caritas in Governing Board of MPSSS.

The General Body congratulated all the new members of the Board.

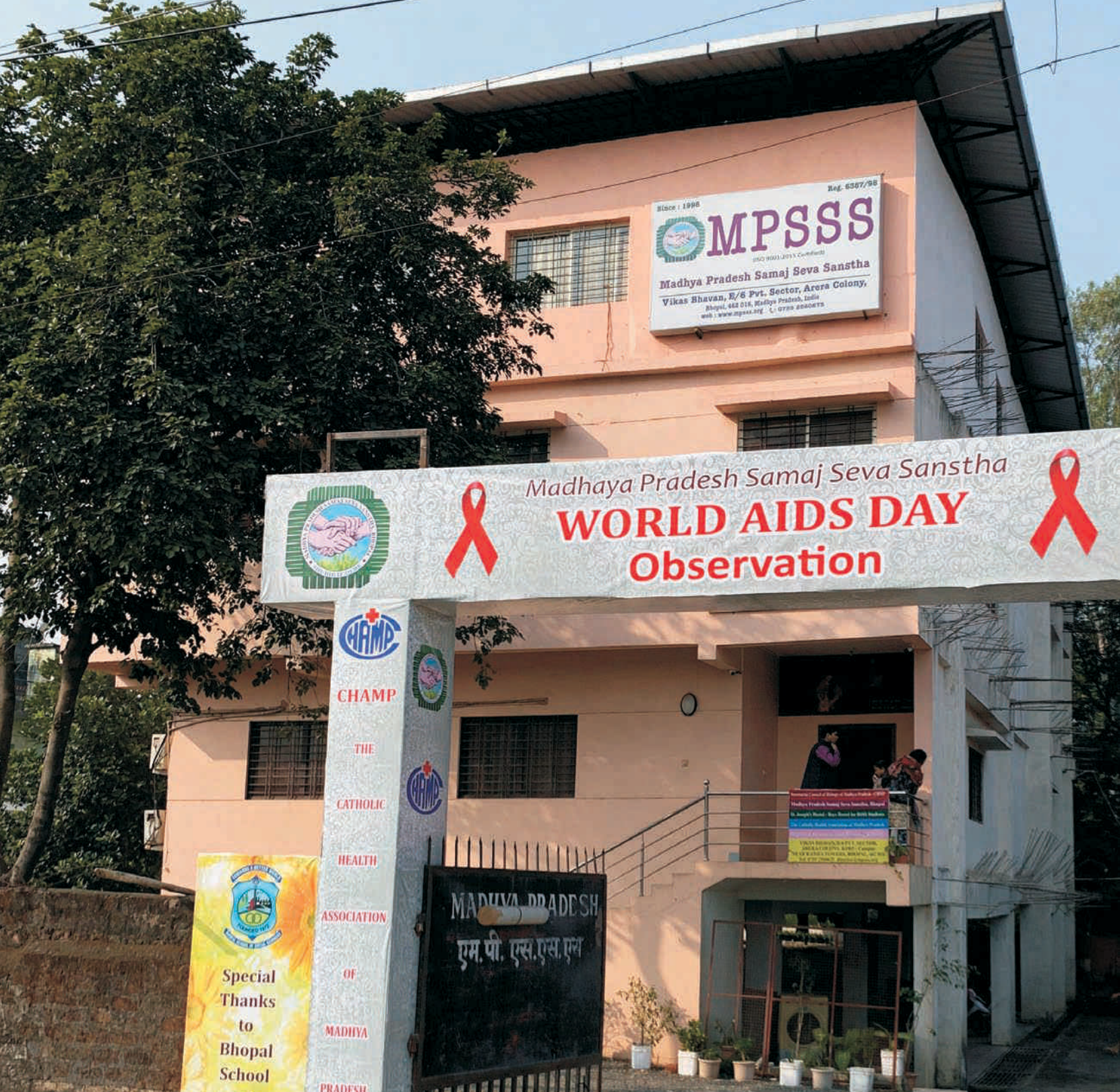
