Webinar on ‘Covid-19 safety and Preparedness’

In association with Caritas India and Catholic Relief Services. The webinar was organized on 25th April, 2020. Mr. Kushal Neogy from CRS facilitated the sessions on COVID-19 symptoms, awareness and the safety methods. Dr Saju represented Caritas India and shared the protocols and SoP’s for functioning. Other members from Caritas as well as CRS shared their insights.



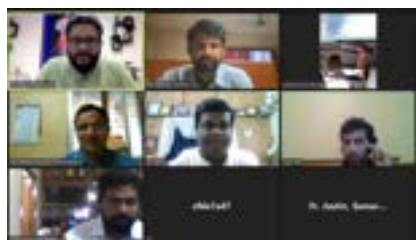
Equipping the staffs and front liners on ‘COVID-19 preparedness’



Sensing the need of enhancing the capacities of frontline workers who are more vulnerable to the infection being involved in the relief work at field level, MPSSS organized multiple sessions for the frontline workers of partner organization through online platform. On 30th April, 2020 a webinar was organized for the frontline workers on ‘COVID-19 awareness and safety measures’ and the participants were taught with the safety practices as they involved in relief operations. More than 21 participants across the region participated in the

webinar. Another webinar was organised on 11th May 2020 and 25 frontline workers from all the partner organization have actively participated and MPSSS Executive Director Fr. Kiran being the resource person took sessions on COVID-19 safety measures and best practices.

DISHA Meetings Held for Sharing the Mutual Learnings



10 Directors Initiative for Self Help and Action-DISHA meetings were conducted during the year. Directors of all the partner organizations actively participated in the discussions.

The discussions were held on various issues of concerns like - progress of COVID relief operations in the region during pandemic, Regional Strategic Plan draft,

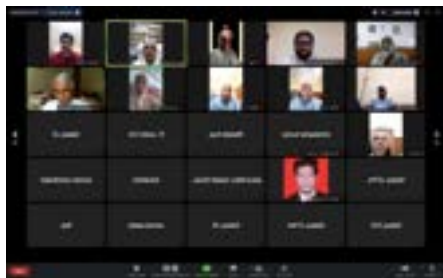


organogram of MPSSS, progress of relief activities and project operation during the new normal, providing the sustainable means of livelihood to the homecoming migrants,

Webinar organized on 'Rehabilitating the migrant workers'



On 22nd May 2020 MPSSSS organized a webinar for all the Faith Based Organizations in the state. Mr. Christopher, Regional Program Officer took session on 'Rehabilitating the migrant workers during COVID-19 crisis' explaining the fate of migrant labourers in Madhya Pradesh and the need for their rehabilitation.

Rev. Dr. Archbishop Leo Cornelio SVD, Chairman

Pastoral Care for Nomads in India along with Rev Bishop Gerald Almeida Chairman for CBCI office for Justice Peace and Development Shared the views. This webinar was organised with the help of CBMP labour Commission. 45 participants representing various organizations actively took part in the sessions.



Reviving the Traditional Food System & Promotion of Minor Millets



MPSSSS have supported partners, namely Jabalpur Diocesan Social Service Society, Khandwa Diocesan Social Services and Pragati Sanstha, Jhabua for the promotion of minor millets. 20 each villages were selected respectively in JDSSS & KDSS and in Pragati Sanstha 30 villages were

selected. We could reach almost 650 small holder farming families and distributed minor millets like Kodo, Kutki, Ragi, Gujro, Hamli, Sino, Jwar, Tilli, Maize, and Khatti Bhindi. The production of the year was nearly 1113 quintals and nearly 1556 Small Holder Farming Families will be benefitting from the live seed banks this year (2021).



Enhancing the Capacities of the Team Members of the Partner Organizations

Capacity Building of the field staffs of partner organizations were held through virtual platform. First session was held on 'Constitutional Rights and COVID-19 crises' on 16th July through zoom platform. Mr. Christopher- Regional Program Officer-MPSSSS conducted the sessions. Session focused on the Constitutional rights and how they have been violated during COVID-19 outbreak and the subsequent lockdowns.



Facts about the constitution, various rights and fundamental duties were points of discussion of the training. 45

participants from the 9 DSSSSs were part of the session.



Webinar organized on breastfeeding

Marking the 'World Breastfeeding Week' from 1st to 7th August, 2020, Madhya Pradesh Samaj Seva Sanstha in collaboration with The Catholic Health Association of Madhya Pradesh had organized a webinar on 6th August, wherein around 45 participants from the partner organizations from rural areas of State participated.

The main aim of the webinar was to spread awareness on breastfeeding and its significance for child growth. Sr. Dr. Shobha, Gynaecologist and Pediatrician was the main resource person for the webinar. She spoke that 'Breast milk is the first vaccine' for an infant and it can prevent children from various diseases.



Webinar on impact of Covid-19 on Animal Husbandary & related fields



Madhya Pradesh Samaj Seva Sanstha organized a Webinar on 16th September 2020 in collaboration with Animal Husbandry department Govt. of Madhya Pradesh. Session focused on impact of Covid-19 on Animal Husbandary & related fields. Dr.M.K. Bhardwaj, Additional Deputy Director veterinary Services Govt. took the session. 61 participants from 9 partner organizations of Madhya Pradesh were part of the meeting.

Webinar on Better Nutrition for Future Generation

Madhya Pradesh Samaj Seva Sanstha organized a webinar in collaboration with The Catholic Health Association of Madhya Pradesh on 19th September 2020 on ICDS services in which 57 participants from 11 districts have actively participated. The resource person was Ms.Lubna Abdullah, State Program head, The Coalition for Food and Nutrotion Security. Discussion was made on the better intervention and increase accesibilty towards ICDS services in order to promote nutritional services for a healthy life. The webinar was helpful to recognize nutritional deficiencies and how to deal with them. On this occasion Fr. Kiran emphasised on community participation in enhancing nutritional services and promote local food and kitchen garden to adress nutritional related issues especially in rural areas.



Interim Evaluations- Staff Meetings held regularly



Staff meetings were held monthly to evaluate the performance of each team member. five such meetings were held online and four meetings offline.

Each Regional Program Officers presented the learnings of their work carried out in the respective months along with skills refined



for professional life. Respective dates of staff meetings were 25th May 2020, 26th June, 29th July, 5th September, 8th October, 7th November, 5th December, 6th February 2021 and 1st March



Team Building and Staff Reflection Program

On 31st October 2020, Staff reflection meeting was organized by MPSSS at Ratapani Jungle Resort near Bhopal and all the staffs actively participated in the event. The meeting was helpful to reflect on yearlong personal performance of each staff member and served to be a fruitful time of recreation and team Building.



Orientation on Minor Research to MPSSS team

On 14th August 2020 MPSSS staffs were oriented on 'Developing and conducting Minor Researches. Dr. Sheeba Joseph, Asst. Professor, BSSS Bhopal oriented the



MPSSS team on the nuances of carrying out the minor research. All the staff members participated in the offline meetings without fail. The Orientation was helpful for the participants to understand the concept of minor research and various important elements of the same. Four Minor researches were initiated as a result of this training.

GST & KSP were Disseminated to Partner Team Members

Catholic Social Teachings and Key Strategic Pillars orientation workshop was conducted for three DSSS staffs namely IDSS Indore, Pragati Jhabua and Kripa Ujjain on 26th, 28th and 30th September respectively. The workshop included training the participants on Principals of CST & KSPs of Caritas India and mainstreaming them into their programmatic activities. Altogether 81 staff



members participated in these three workshops along with the respective DSSS Directors. Regional Program Officer Mr. Christopher was the resource person for these workshops.



Orientation to Volunteers on Nutrition Enhancement



2 days capacity enhancement workshop was held for the Selected Volunteers on 27th & 28th November 2020.

Altogether 62 participants were part of the training. Training was organized at Kripa Training Centre Ujjain. Training started with a prayer and Welcoming of the participants were done by Fr. Sunil

G., Director of Kripa. He addressed the participants and congratulated them for their voluntary work which they have done and asked them to further continue to do the good works for the development of the rural communities.

Handholding Support Visit to Partners



Mr. Christopher, RPO visited one of the partners at Indore (Indore Diocese Social Service Society) on 24th February 2021 and interacted with the Director Fr. Mukesh Machar and key staffs on upcoming state level Lenten Launch and formation of Diocese level Child Parliament.



Similar visits were also held at KDSS, Khandwa and MVSS, Sagar on 23rd & 25th March 2021 respectively. Mr. Christopher, Regional Program Officer, MPSSS interacted with the Directors Frs Jayan Alax & Thomas Philip and key staffs of

the key staffs of the organizations. The objective of the visit was to have discussion on formation of Child Parliament and District level farmers clubs.



State Level Lenten Campaign Launch 2021

MPSSS organized State level Lenten launch on 7th March, 2021 at St. Arnold's Parish, Vijaynagar, Indore with the support of IDSSS (Indore Diocese Social Service Society), Indore.



Bp Chacko Thottumarickal SVD Bishop of Indore and Secretary to CBMP Bhopal inaugurated the Campaign. All the parish members including the youths and the IDSSS team participated in the event which also commemorated the 'World Women's day' in the Diocese.

The parish members including the dignitaries Dr. Saju, Zonal Officer, Caritas, Fr. Kiran, Fr. John V, Parish Priest, Fr. Pious and Fr. Godwin of Indore Diocese and Mr. Christopher, Regional Program Officer of MPSSS participated in the launch.



Training of Volunteers on “Healthy Life Healthy India”



Two days training of trainers was organized for the youths on 13th & 14th March 2021 at Divine Retreat Center, Kolar, Bhopal. TOT was organized by MPSSS under State Lanten Campaign “Healthy Life Healthy India”. The objective of the workshop was to orient the youths on the issues of mental health, physical fitness, communicable and non-communicable disease, HIV-Aids,

Catholic Social Teaching & Organic Agricultural Practices further promoting ‘Healthy Life Healthy India.’ Fr. Biju Thottankara, Secretary CBMP was invited as a chief guest, Mrs. Kala Mohan, Director - NIDAAAN, Mrs. Durga Mishra, Trainer - Physical Fitness and Yoga, Regional Youth Coordinator Fr. Alexander, Fr. Kiran, Executive Director and MPSSS team were also part of the event and took sessions on various topics.





INITIATE AND ASSIST PARTNERS AT ALL LEVELS OF PROJECT CYCLE MANAGEMENT FOR THEMATIC DEVELOPMENT

COVID- 19 Emergency Relief Operations



In the wake of COVID-19 outbreak and the subsequent lockdowns, MPSSS extended their helping hands towards the worst affected masses in the state. The organization distributed 712 dry ration kits, 240 meals and 250 Hygiene Kits to the needy communities in Bhopal. In Collaboration with Bhopal School of Social Sciences, Holy Family Sr Sec School and Amala Province

Sisters the organization also distributed food materials to the travelling migrants.

Survey with Government Authorities



MPSSS team along with the Director, have participated in the COVID-19 emergency survey organized by government authorities in the containment zones of Bhopal city. The Areas included Nehru Nagar, Kamla Nagar, Danapani Area etc. The survey continued for three consecutive days starting from 20th to 22nd April, 2020 under the supervision of Mr. Prakash Chowhan, Additional Collector Bhopal. The objective of the survey was to identify the suspected number of people with COVID symptoms.

Partner Level COVID-19 Relief Operations

All partners of MP forum were actively involved in supporting the needy during Covid-19 crisis. Dry ration kits were distributed and cooked food was served at the community level. Hygiene kits and face masks were distributed with the help of



the volunteers in the villages. Awareness was created at the community level on hand washing, social distancing and other hygiene practices through wall painting and street announcements and demonstrations. Communities were also sensitized on COVID-19 pandemic and its symptoms.

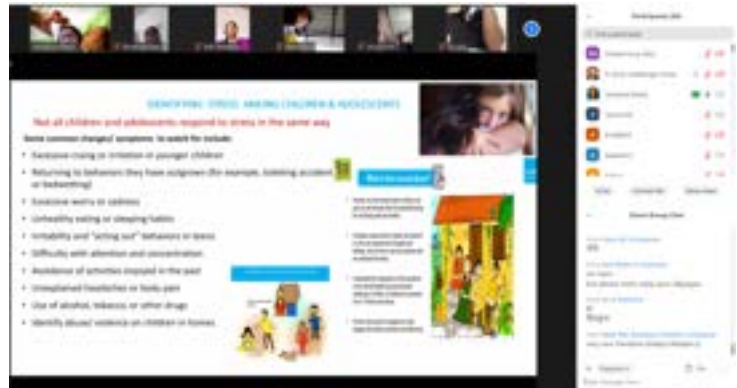




Webinar organized on Adolescent Health issues

A webinar was organized by MPSSS on 'Adolescent Health and related issues' on 1st June 2020. Resource person from different health streams were invited for sharing their point of concerns.

Mr. Amar Prakash-Program Coordinator, Water Aid India, Ms. Pushpa Awasthy - Nutrition Officer, Unicef, Dr. Vandana Bhatiya - Health Specialist, UNICEF MP, Dr. Shobha - Gynaecologist, Mr. Nageeswar Patidar, WASH Officer, UNICEF, MP were the speakers of the webinar. Various sessions on Menstrual Hygiene and challenges, Nutrition issues, psychosocial support for adolescent and Sanitation during COVID-19 crisis were discussed in the webinar. Above 100 Participants from different districts of MP took part in the discussions.



Capacity Enhancement of Community Facilitators



A webinar was conducted by MPSSS for building the capacities of the community facilitators on 25th June 2020. The online session was conducted on 'Good Parenting during COVID-19 crisis' by Mr. Michael-Regional Program Officer, MPSSS.

The main objective of the webinar was to help the participants understand the role of parents in up-bringing their children in times of crisis. Safeguarding the children from the misuse of internet and mobile phones and proper parental communication were also discussed during the webinar.



Community Health Program was Reviewed



Community Health Coordinators- (CHC) along with project team joined online review meeting on 30th of July 2020 virtually. The participants were Fr. Kiran, Mr. Kiran APM-CHAI, all CHCs and Mr. Balendra Singh Kaurav RPO-MPSSS.

In the meeting CHCs presented their activity highlights for the last 9 months - October 2019 to June 2020 through PPT and discussed on the upcoming activities. Fr. Kiran suggested the CHCs to focus on model village on priority basis to further develop each of the selected as model village.



National Review of Community Health Program was held online

On 22nd July 2020 Regional Program Officers- (RPO) review meeting was organized by CHAI. RPOs from various regions participated in the same. Ms. Indra (PM-CHAI) shared on extension of the project till March 2021. The status of the objectives 1 & 2 of the present project was shared by the RPOs. Activities to be carried for the extended period was discuss by all. Lastly Mr. Kiran (APM-CHAI) focused attention on timely submission of reports to CHAI.

Special Awareness program on Covid-19

Special awareness program on Covid-19 was conducted in 25 villages of MP and CG with Support of 5 Member Institutions. Objective of the program was to create awareness on Corona Virus and personal hygiene through mike Announcement. Altogether 20,171 people from the intervention villages were covered during awareness. Mask, Gloves, and Dry ration kits to the poor families of the community were distributed during Covid-19 Pandemic.



Wall painting about Covid-19

Wall paintings and writing on COVID-19 were made in different locations covering 25 villages of MP and CG, with support of community health program. Through the wall paintings and writings displayed in prominent locations, awareness was created in the community on Covid-19 pandemic.



Coordination with the PLDP Field staffs



Timely coordination was done with the field staffs of the PLDP team. Update on field activities was shared and staffs were also guided and informed on organizing the activities for the International Breast Feeding day. Guidance was provided to the staffs on various issues such as

- Conducting activities like meetings in small groups with women & adolescent,
- Wall writings on positive messages on

importance of breast feeding,

- Audio-video making of positive stories from the lactating mothers.

Creating awareness on breast feeding in the field

Various activities were organized during the Week beginning from 1st to 7th August, 2020 at the ground level spreading awareness on importances of breast feeding. Wallpaintings, awareness session and counselling with social distancing for lactating mothers, promotion of nutritious food and sharing success stories by mothers were some of the activities held during the the week. The activities were implemented in 16 districts of Madhya Pradesh.

Malnutrition can be addressed through Drumstick Plants



MPSSS has distributed Drumstick seeds to all its partners. The home based nurseries were made and healthy saplings were planted at one's own farm land and road side.

The farmers were happy to receive the seeds in time. Drumsticks are often used as nutritional supplementation.

Nearly 1,25,000 seeds were distributed and nearly 82,000 plants are still surviving. The plants were mainly given to the families who are having children below the age of five.



National Nutrition Month was celebrated with special



MPSSS in collaboration with partner organizations spread at different parts of the state observed the whole month of September, 2020 as the National Nutrition Month to promote nutritional intake among Women and Children.

The primary objective of the celebration of 'Poshan Maah' was to take the messages of POSHAN to the grass root level.

During the POSHAN Maah, women SHG members, adolescent girls participated in various kinds of activities to spread the important messages on nutrition such as importance of diet and dietary diversity, breast-feeding, complimentary feeding, immunization, growth monitoring, hygiene-water-sanitation, anaemia, adolescent education, age of marriage and antenatal check-ups.

Adolescent Girls were also created awareness on the use of millets, kitchen gardens, cleanliness, balanced diet, consumption of green leafy vegetables and pulses, proper physical and mental development and safe menstrual health & hygiene etc were discussed at the grassroots level among the communities.



ANWC PLD Villages were visited by MPSSS Director

ANWC fields were accompanied by Fr. Kiran & Mr. Michael from MPSSS. Four villages were visited during the two days field trip. Discussions were held on the progress of the PLD Process in the villages. Community members shared the following learnings from the project such as Organic farming and manure preparations, traditional farming practices its good results. They further shared that crops rotation practices were helpful to improve soil health, optimize nutrients in the soil, and combat pest and weed issues.



People Led Development Process New Phase Planning Meeting

The PLDP new Phase Planning Meeting was held through Zoom video conferencing platform on 7th October, 2020. Fr. Kiran-Director, MPSSS, partners Directors, Zonal Coordinators, Coordinators, & MPSSS PLDP team were part of the meeting.



Last two years Goals, Objectives, Indicators were presented for both the West & Central Zones and MPSSS. Achievements of activities and challenges were the highlights of the presentation done by Mr. Maria Michael-Regional Program Officer. Best practices, gaps & scope for improvement too were shared. Participants have actively discussed on setting up priorities for the next phase. Few commonly agreed priorities highlighted during the discussions were nutrition, collective action & livelihood.

National Review of Community Health Program was held



Project Review cum Experience Sharing & Learning Meeting and Orientation on No Cost Extension was held on 16th October 2020 and was organized by CHAI. Fr. Kiran, Director-MPSSS and Mr. Balendra Singh Kaurav, Regional Program Officer, MPSSS were part of the meeting. Experience sharing on the achievements & challenges were shared by Mr.

Balendra Singh along with other experiences of the field and the significant changes observed too were shared.

Member Institutions in the state of Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh Visited

Visit to Member Institutions of Chhattisgarh was done from 3rd to 10th January 2021 by Mr. Balendra Singh Kaurav-Regional program officer.

Objective of the visit was to have discussion with Community Health Coordinators and Community Health Volunteers of Member Institutions on Food Kit distribution program and Mid and Long term Rehabilitation training/vocational training. Centres visited were Jeevan Jyoti Health Centre, Lakhanpur, Dist. Surguja, Holy Family Health Centre, Beltoli, Dist. Jashpur and JMJSSS, Bhilai, Dist. Durg (CG)



Visit to Member Institutions of Sagar (Dt) M. P. was done from 12th to 13th January 2020. Centres visited were Manav Vikas Seva Sangh & St. Joseph Social Centre, Banda.



PLDP Interim External Evaluation



PLD Partners interim external evaluation was held in the entire month of January 2021. Each partner hosted the visit for two days.

4 villages and 40 home visits (10 home visit per village) were held. Dr. Aneesh Jose from Kerala was the external evaluator for the evaluation. Interactions were held in the community meetings and personal

interaction were done during the home visits in which success of PLDP work was observed.

Researcher visited total 36 villages and conducted 35 community meetings with targeted people. 367 families individually from 36 villages were contacted to collect the basic data. Researcher has also met 08 directors, 08 Coordinators and 29 community facilitators during his visit. Qualitative observation methods were used during the evaluation.

Participation in Webinar on International Workers Day



On the occasion of International workers day - May 1st, Mr. Christopher- Regional Program Officer participated in the webinar conducted by CBCI labour commission on 'COVID relief for the migrant workers' and presented the activities and the future plans of MP Region and shared the proposed focus on helping the migrant workers returned to the region. In the Pan India conference, representatives from all the Regions participated

and presented their activities.

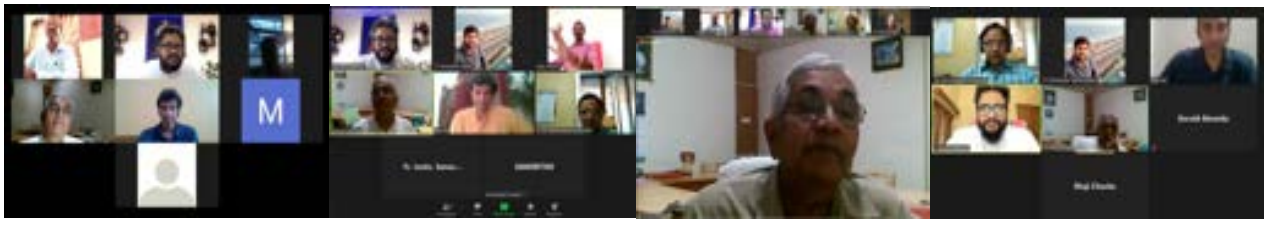
Five GBM conducted during the financial Year 2020-2021

MPSSS Governing Body Meetings were conducted through Zoom online Video Conferencing Platform on 16th May, 23rd July, 31st August, 29th October and 9th January 2021 respectively to increase transparency and precision. Amendments and guidelines for new normal. The activities of the previous quarters along with financial reports and the proposed action plans were presented

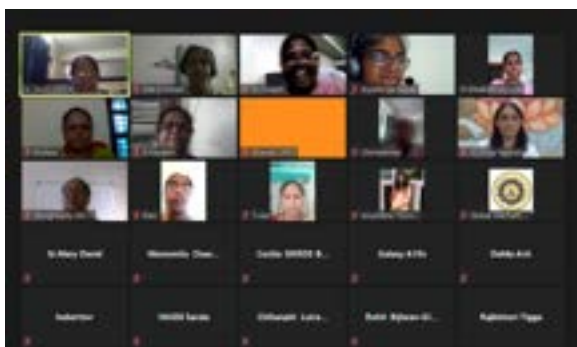

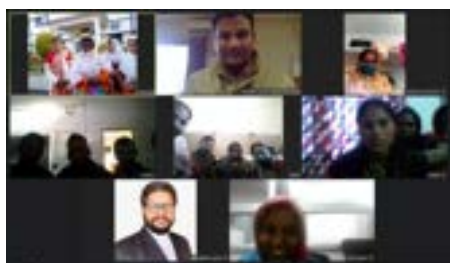

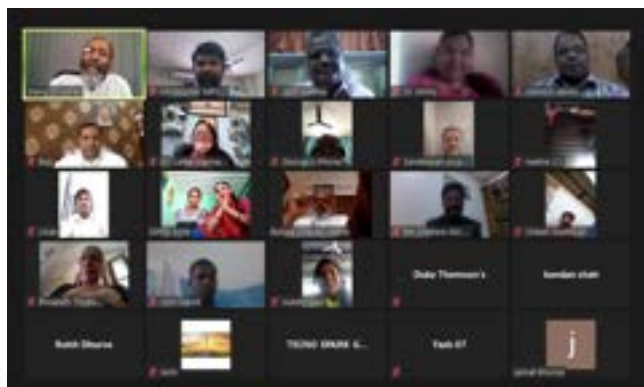

breast-feeding, immunization, growth monitoring, hygiene-water-sanitation, anemia, sex education, antenatal check-ups and kitchen gardens etc.

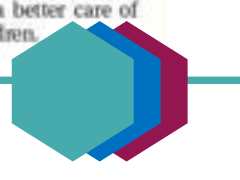
Webinar on social activities held on MPSSS Foundation Day

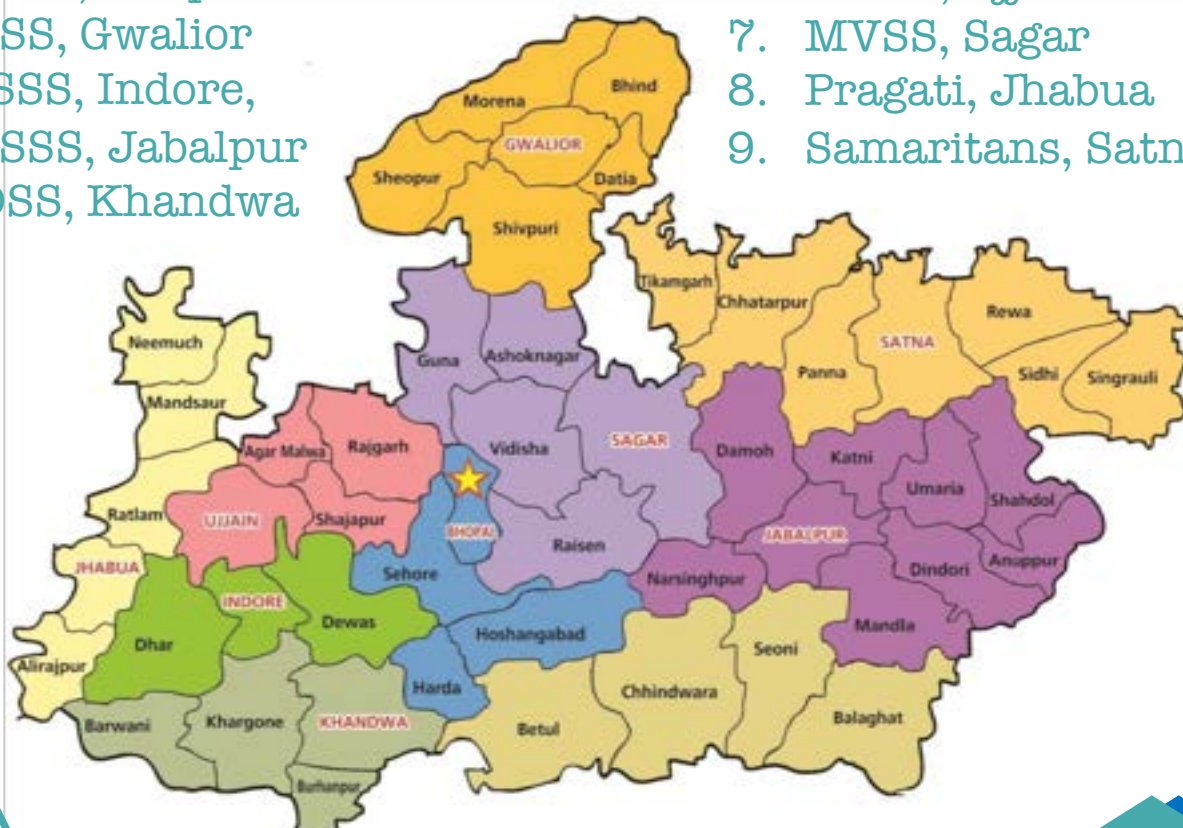
