





MPSSS - FORMATION HISTORY

Madhya Pradesh Samaj Seva Sanstha (MPSSS) was instituted by the Bishops of the region for the facilitation and coordination of the development activities of the Catholic Church in the region. Fourteen Diocesan Social Service Societies (DSSS) of the states of Madhya Pradesh & Chhattisgarh were the constituent members of this organization. A brief history of MPSSS is given below:-

First Attempt

In the year 1982-1983 there was an attempt made by the Diocesan Directors of Social work of Madhya Pradesh to constitute a forum of Social Work in MP. The bylaws were formulated so that a society could be registered. This could not materialize as there were some technical problems.

IDEA, Second Attempt

A second attempt was initiated in 1988 by Mr. Charles D'Cruz and was supported by four dioceses of Madhya Pradesh for the formation of a common desk by the name of 'Inter Diocesan Education for Action (IDEA)' to promote people's development and social action. Gradually the concept of IDEA spread to other dioceses also but owing to unforeseen circumstances it also met with a natural death.

Formation of the Forum

In the year 1997 the Bishops of Madhya Pradesh wanted to create a Forum of Social Work in the Region. In order to initiate the process of forming the forum Bishops appointed Rev. Fr. Francis. T as the first secretary to the Commission of Social Work under the Council of Bishops of MP (CBMP). Rev. Fr. Francis. T could succeed in registering a society under the name of "Madhya Pradesh Samaj Seva Sanstha" (MPSSS) on 25th September 1998 bearing the No.6387/98. It started functioning from Seva Sadan, Second Stop, Bhopal. It has gradually attained the status of coordinating agency (NGO) for all the development programmes in the 13 dioceses of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh Region.

Though basically it covered the target States of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, the jurisdiction of the Forum has been extended to the "Whole India" through an amendment in the Memorandum of Association duly certified by the registrar of Firms and Societies on 20 December 2002. MPSSS has also obtained the FCRA registration under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976 from the Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India on 15th March 2004.



- MPSSS has already initiated and started a process to achieve its own organizational development through workshops, constant reflection and reviews, formation of policies, consultation with experts etc. as a result of this we have developed policies like HR, Finance, Gender policy, child protection policy, monitoring and evaluation policy. We have developed some systems and structures such as Regional Review and planning meeting, monthly meetings, quarterly meetings etc.

People's led development process

Animation- the animation project executed in all the Dioceses of Madhya Pradesh supported by MISEREOR. Under this project partners have focussed their attention on agriculture-based activities as source of livelihood/ food security. MPSSS has facilitated this process through various programs like community situation analysis, identifying the traditional methods of farming, local seeds, traditional pest management, sharing of various experiences in farming and other economic programs. Partners have further facilitated the farmers to become self-dependent for their development. They have been also facilitated to form farmers club, start seed bank, promote traditional seeds collection, traditional practices, organic fertilizers and traditional knowledge of indigenous practices etc. two partners have facilitated the promotion of system of rice intensification and system of wheat intensification technique in model plot.

Farmer/People Led Development Approach-The traditional agriculture practices of the farmers are very valuable and they are well suited to the climate and local conditions. They have proven knowledge and experiences on agriculture and farming system which have to be documented and promoted. So, under the name of Farmer Led Development Approach promotion of traditional agriculture farming and organic farming was carried out. Under this program MPSSS have conducted exposure visits for the coordinators and Directors so that they may come to know the benefits of taking such activities. It helped us to understand the various aspect of this approach. Earlier four districts of Madhya Pradesh namely Satna, Sagar, Ujjain and Mandla have made intensive efforts to follow this approach in the selected villages. An orientation meeting in pursuance of it was taken at Satna in November 2011 focusing on peoples Led development Approach, facilitated by Mr.Emmanuel Yap (MISEREOR Consultant). With this orientation meeting participants got a clear idea of People Led Development Process and it was decided that the upcoming project of the MPSSS and Partners Dioceses will be purely based on People Led Development Approach.

Achievements of the Project

- PLDP Perspective building workshop dated 7-12 October 2103- was organized to develop more clarity on concept & practices of PLD process both at forum & zonal level for better implementation of the process at the grassroot level. The workshop was facilitated by Mr.Emmanuel Yap (MISEREOR Consultant) & Fr.Jacob (Director CDH). The main focus was on need to increase community participation in problem identification, seeking remedial measures & achieving the result through self-initiative were identified as emerging pathway to execute real PLD.
- Workshops and capacity enhancement on FRA, Reporting & documentation, micro planning and climate change helped the DSSS staffs on the issues faced and address them effectively stron network & linkages with the Government departments developed and helped the community to avail benefits of various schemes run by State & Central Govt. (MGNREGA, RGGVY, NABARD, MSY, JSY, Old age & widow pension etc.)
- Exchange & exposure visits between villages has helped to replicate the best practices of one area to the other
- Gram sabha participation helped the beneficiaries to have access of land entitlement, through their own initiatives with the help of Forest right act 2006
- A peer-learning workshop facilitated by Mr.Manny Misereor, Mr.PM. Philips HOD partners support, Caritas India on 31st May to 3rd June 2014.

- MPSSS with the support of Misereor organized Climate Change resilience workshop at Jabalpur facilitated by Ms.Calre on 29th April to 2nd May 2014
- Brainstorming workshop was organized for two days from 18th to 19th November 2014 for the follow-up of PLDP proposal facilitated by Mr.Saju followed by sharing and discussion on the same
- Regular basis Monitoring & Evaluation visits are organized to the partner areas for interaction with the communities & to accompany in the PLD Process
- Climate change workshop was organized at Indore & Ujjain facilitated by Misereor Climate Change Resilience Consultant Ms.Calre Westwood
- Peer learning meet was organized which was facilitated by Ms.Ester Scarf, the PLDP Consultant from Misereor
- Internal Evaluation of the First Phase of PLDP took place in the month of October 2015
- PLDP partners from various parts of India (Orissa, Maharashtra etc.) came to Bhopal for a partners meet and visited the field of MVSS, Sagar and had a very interactive learning session with the team of PLDP-MP in November 2015
- Village profile format developed in both Hindi and English and sent to all DSSSs for timely updating
- External visit was conducted by MISEREOR from 6th Non, 2016 to 5th Dec, 2016
- Staff training and orientation on effective outreach and skills to win community participation in Kripa Ujjain was organized from 25th to 26th July, 2016

Mr.Maria Michael & Ms. Natasha Sharma - Regional Program Officers from MPSSS oriented the staffs on organic agricultural methods and practices as a means to address the issue of malnutrition.

Farmers Exposure visit was organized for two consecutive days 26th & 27th February 2020 at Meghnagar, Jhabua. 43 participants including Farmers, Coordinators and Facilitators from 9 DSSSs were part of the program.

RLEP change facilitators in motion

Fifth Regional Learning and Exchange Platform (RLEP) workshop from 3rd to 11th July 2019 was held at Maumere, Indonesia for Facilitating Change Processes towards Food Sovereignty in South Asia.



Collaboration with Raise & Rise Campaign

Raise and Rise campaign was held in the month of April. Campaign focus was on addressing child abuses. MPSSS in collaboration with Angels and other organizations was part of the campaign. Various activities were organized with schools, in slums and bastis. Ms.Natasha represented MPSSS and participated in the various activities organized.



Exploring the Collaboration possibilities with Hospitals-Visits of Hospitals of Indore Diocese and Ujjain Diocese were done on 11th & 12th April 2019. Fr.Kiran, Director-MPSSS, Regional Program Officers, MPSSS-Mr.Balveer Mehra & Balendra Singh Kaurav were part of the visit. Purpose of the visits was to identify the possibilities of collaboration with hospitals. Discussion was held with the hospitals Director's and administrations on various schemes.



Zonal Review Meetings were held to keep the track

Annual review meetings of PLDP was held at both the Central Zone & West Zone in the month of July 2019.Program Officer of MPSSS PLDP team were part of the meeting held at Jabalpur & Bhopal. Presentations were done by the Coordinators of the DSSSs. Experiences were shared during the meetings. DSSSs Directors and MPSSS team participated in the Zonal Review meeting.



PLD India Project planning meeting held at Bhubneshwar

PLDP India partners' level review and reflection meeting was held for 2 days from 13 to 14 August 2019 at Bhubaneswar. Participants from Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Assam were part of the meeting. Meeting focus on Reflections- Integration of learning/Issues and challenges on RLEP in change process towards achieving food sovereignty at Organisational level, Change facilitator's level and Community level. In the end future plan ahead discussed and finalized.



Workshop on Indigenous Safeguard Policies rights

3 days' workshop on International Safeguard Policies to Sustain IPs Rights in India was held from 20th July to 22nd July 2019 at Pastoral Centre, Bhopal Organized by MPSSS Bhopal, Co-organized by PLDP India, Supported by MISEREOR. Objective of the workshop was to discuss on International safe guard policies to sustain IPs rights in India" on issues related to food sovereignty, GMO, mining, land right, FRA, PESA etc.



Awareness creation on Social Issues at schools for Behaviour Change Team of MPSSS conducted 27 awareness sessions in the quarter in 17 schools. Issues of concern were discussed with children. Various sessions taken were teaching habits in children, malaria, climate change, leprosy, HIV/AIDS, health & hygiene, child abuse, practical learnings, menstrual hygiene, career guidance. Sessions were held at schools of Khandwa, Bhopal, Indore, Sehore, Gwalior and Chattisgarh district.



World Aid's Day Observation: Aspiring for AIDS free Madhya Pradesh- MPSSS in collaboration with BSSS College organized awareness campaign on World Aid's Day i.e., 1st December 2019 spreading awareness on prevention and eradication of the epidemic. Motorcycle Rally was organized from MPSSS office to BSSS College crossing the major public areas. Through a street play by the students of BSSS College and Asha Niketan nursing students the preventive measures and precaution of the disease were demonstrated at several locations of Bhopal like market place and Public Park so as to attract more and more public attention on HIV/AIDS.



Networking & Linkages meeting with the likeminded NGOs

In the year 2019-2020 two networking & linkages meeting were held with the other like-minded NGOs at MPSSS Office, Bhopal. During these meetings we had an important message from a Government School Teacher on the present status of the govt. schools in Madhya Pradesh. Orissa region Fr.John and Mr.Kalicharan participated in the meeting along with other representatives from 20 NGOs .The main purpose of the meeting was to have discussion on issues related to malnutrition, What are we doing to reduce Malnutrition and Further plan of action was made about conducting sessions in Schools to reduce Malnutrition. The discussion was very fruitful.



54th Governing Body Meeting of MPSSS

54th Governing Body Meeting of MPSSS was held at Sneha Sadan, Bishop's House, Jabalpur on 10th January, 2020. Chairman Bishop Jerald Almeida, JDSSS Director Fr. George, Fr. Kiran of MPSSS and Mr. Shaji Director ANWC participated in the meeting.



WIF conference on ‘Future of Work’

Workers India Federation in collaboration with CBCI office for labour organized their annual conference on the theme ‘Future of Work’ from 12 to 14, January, 2020. The Major objective of the meeting was to discuss the concept of Work/employment in the future with special reference to unorganized workers and their rights. Mr. Christopher Regional Program Officer-MPSSS attended the conference and presented the report of Madhya Pradesh region.



PACNI Annual meet

Regional Program Officer, Mr. Christopher attended PACNI (Pastoral Care for Nomads in India) annual conference held at Pastoral centre on 7th of February, 2020. It was a PAN India meeting organized to discuss on the problems and issues faced by the Nomadic community across the country and to strengthen the initiatives to support them.



Half Yearly Review of PLDP

Two days Annual Review Meeting was held at Pastoral Centre, Bhopal from 11th & 12th February 2020. Directors, Zonal Coordinators, and Coordinators from 9 DSSSs and PLDP team from MPSSS participated in the meeting. Total 32 participants were part of the meeting. Welcome address was given by Fr. Kiran-Director, MPSSS. Ms. Mildred, General Manager, NABARD was also present for the event and visited the traditional seeds stall organized by the DSSSs and interacted with the participants.

Regional Forum level training on Lenten campaign innovations

Webinar on 'Covid-19 safety and Preparedness'

Keeping in view of the safety of its partners during COVID-19 relief operation across the state, MPSSS has initiated sessions on 'COVID-19 safety and preparedness' for all the partner organizations and their directors through online platform. In association with Caritas India and Catholic Relief Services. The webinar was organized on 25th April, 2020. Mr. Kushal Neogy from CRS facilitated the sessions on COVID-19 symptoms, awareness and the safety methods. Dr Saju represented Caritas India and shared the protocols and SoP's for functioning. Other members from Caritas as well as CRS shared their insights.

MPSSS organized a one-day workshop on 15th April 2019. Fr.Kiran-Director MPSSS gave a warm welcome to all the participants informing the objective of the workshop. A short movie named Komal on child abuse was screened. 30 teachers from various schools of Bhopal were part of the training.



More than 65 frontline social workers participated in the webinar on „Nutrition and COVID waves“ in view of the predicted 3rd wave of COVID-19. Resource person Mr. Balendra Singh Kaurav-Regional Program Officer-CHAI took sessions on various nutritious foods especially the immunity boosters and the participants actively participated in the discussions.

SAMANVAYA training on Children Parliament

On 21st December 2021, a SAMANVAYA meeting was held online and 13 participants from the partner organizations attended and were sensitized on „The Children Parliament.“ Ms. Natasha Sharma, Regional Program Officer of MPSSS took sessions on the concept of Children Parliament and explained various issues and concerns related to the same. The sessions were helpful for the partners Coordinators to understand the importance and various methods and techniques to form the same in their respective project locations.



Training on Agro-Business initiatives On 15th March 2022 training program was conducted for the Directors and other representatives along with the volunteers in the region on Agro-Business initiatives for the region. The meeting was helpful to understand the importance of „Organic farming for the future generations.“ Mr. Alwyn Lobo from Nasik was invited as a resource person to share insights on the production and distribution of organic agricultural produces. MPSSS staff along with Fr. Jayan and Mr. Susheel, Program Executive from Khandwa and Fr. Ajo George from Satna, MPSSS staffs along with three student interns participated in the meeting.

Organizational Development Visits

Regional Program Officer, Mr. Christopher undertook visits to two of the partners namely, Asha Niketan Welfare Center - Bhopal and Gwalior Catholic Seva Samaj – Gwalior on 22nd June and 24th June respectively. Jhabua Diocesan level Small Farmers Consortium -On 6th December, 2021 Jhabua Diocesan level Small Farmers Consortium formation was organized at Pragati Sanstha, Meghnagar. Regional Program Officer Mr. Christaphar participated and facilitated the event. 90 Small holder farmers from Jhabua and Alirajpur Districts were part of the meeting along with Fr. Peter, director of Pragati. Mr. Ajay Singh Bariya, an officer from the Agriculture Department and Mrs. Leela Damor, officer from Revenue department were also part of the event and shared information on various issues of the farmers during the program.

On 14th March 2022, Regional Program Officer Mr. Christopher visited JDSSS and met the director Fr. Premanand and spoke about the concern related to the sustainability of the organization and the existing policies. He further shared the plan of documenting the Safe guarding policy for the region.



Khandwa Diocesan Children Parliament formed

Mr. Christaphar, Region Program Officer attended Formation meeting of the diocesan Level Children Parliament at Khandwa on 14th September. Altogether 44 children from across the diocese representing 3 districts (Burhanpur, Khandwa and Khargone) were part of the meeting and the election took place and the parliament was formed. A mock parliament session too was held and all the elected members actively participated in the sessions.



Indore Diocesan Level Children Parliament formed

On 25th November 2021, Indore Diocesan Level Children Parliament was formed at IDSSS, Indore. 25 children representing three districts namely Indore and Dewas participated in the program. Election was conducted and Mr. Christopher, Regional Program Officer from MPSSS facilitated the event.



Preparation of Nutrition Powder MPSSS team prepared the Nutrition Powder Kit for the selected malnourished children of Raisen district. The nutrition powder consists of 8 types of food grains namely Soya Bean, Corn, Barley, Green gram, Pearl Millet, Cashew, Groundnuts, Black gram. First and foremost, purchased food grains were cleaned and roasted and then were given for grinding. The entire MPSSS team had volunteered to mix, grind and further pack Nutrition powder for distribution.



Nutrition Enhancement Program MPSSS organized visit to Raisen district on 2nd & 5th March 2022 for distribution of nutrition powder to the under nourished child and seeds packets to pregnant and lactating women. Mr.Saju, Ms.Natasha and 1 volunteer were part of the visit. Visit was organized at anganwadi centers for distributing the nutrition powder and seeds packets to pregnant and lactating women. Asha and Anganwadi worker and mother and relatives who brought the child were explained about the consumption of the powder. They were informed that powder is made of 8 food grains green pulses, corn, bajra, black gram, cashew, soyabean, barley and groundnut. 1 kg jaggery was also provided and they were informed the different recipes they can make from the powder depending on the choice of child how he/she is comfortable in eating. Seeds packets provided to the pregnant and lactating women contain types of seeds brinjal, tomato, coriander, green chilly, beans, pumpkin, spinach, ridge gourd.



Awareness Campaign on Addressing Malnutrition 2 days awareness campaign was organized on malnutrition at Raisen district on 10th and 11th March 2022 with the support of Misereor. Total 6 villages named Agariya, Khamariya, Sivani , Bijora, Markhandi ,Borkhadi were visited of the Raisen district. Meeting was held at the anganwadi center in which community members were informed about the malnutrition. They were asked that they themselves can address malnutrition among women and children by having nutritious food. They were asked to have kitchen garden at homes in which they can plant vegetables for daily use so that they will be getting nutritious fresh and chemical free vegetables at their homes.


Wall Paintings on malnutrition -The wall paintings were carried out in selected villages of the six diocesan partners PLDP villages. Villages were selected from PLD implementing areas where prevalence of Nutrition Deficiency is noticed along with anemic woman. 2 wall paintings in a prominent space of the village were made. The Minimum size of the painting could be 6 x 4 (24) feet. This will help the community members to read and get information.



GBMs and AGBMs of MPSSS were conducted GBM held on 19th June 2021 in which all the members participated in the virtual meeting including Bp. Gerald Almeida and the newly elected Vice president Bp. Sebastian of Ujjain. The discussions were held on various issues related to the development and growth of the Regional Forum.



GBM and the AGBM meetings held virtually on 31st July, 2021 and all the Governing body members participated in the meeting. Discussions took place on various issues related to the strengthening of Forum level activities in the region. Another GBM of MPSSS was conducted on 31st August from 5:30 PM with the newly elected members and discussions were held on the sustainability of the Forum.



On 11th March 2021, Governing Body Meeting was held at MPSSS and most of the board members came together for the physical meeting after Covid-19. It was almost 2 years of the one –to-one meeting. Discussion took place on the way forward and sustainability of Forum and its activities. The meeting began from 3.30 PM in the afternoon and Bp. Gerald Almeida, Chairman along with Bp. Sebastian of Ujjain participated in the meeting.






Webinar on World Breast feeding week


RCCE bi-weekly meet



Food for a Million campaign: Food for millions program started from 2nd September 2021 and it was the initiative of MPSSS to provide basic meal to the destitute people in the region. The project aims to provide One Million meals across the state. Campaign is providing one time meal of the day to the poor and destitute peoples of Bhopal district. In the month of September altogether 935 food packets were distributed to the destitute people in Bhopal rural area and MPSSS and CHAMP staff members voluntarily participated in the food preparation and distribution.



Webinar on “Upholding Child rights in MP” On 31st August from 2:30 PM a webinar on „Upholding Child rights in MP“ was organized by MPSSS. Resource persons Mr. Kamal Thakur from CHILDLINE and Mrs. Kalamohan from NIDAAN oriented participants on the importance of child rights especially in the state of Madhya Pradesh. More than 75 participants from all the DSSS partook in the sessions. The sessions were useful for the participants to understand how to address the psychological needs of the children in the new normal scenario.



“Forum support for the formation of safeguarding policy” project orientation: On 22nd September, 2021 from 10 AM an online meeting was held with Mr. Kushal from CRS through zoom online platform on the upcoming project called „Forum support for the formation of Safeguarding policy“ and its EOI preparation.



Volunteers oriented on “Healthy Life and Healthy India” On 27th and 28th September two days training was organized for the Volunteers in the region on the Lenten theme „Healthy Life and Healthy India“ in collaboration with Young Catholic Movement (YCS) and Young Students Movement (YSM) at Divine Retreat Center, Bhopal. More than 60 young volunteers participated in the training and sessions were held on Emotional Intelligence, Health and Hygiene and even personality development etc.



Participation of Stakeholder planning meeting organized by SAMMAN On 30th November, a Stakeholder planning meeting was organized by SAMMAN for the welfare and development of children, women and youths especially in the slums living in poverty. Mr. Christopher Regional Program Officer, MPSSS participated in the meeting and shared his views on the same.



Exposure visit for an MBA student- An MBA Student was facilitated at MPSSS to learn about the organizational culture of an Non-Governmental Organization. Mr. Monish Johnson, student of MBA visited MPSSS and was oriented on the work of the organizations and various projects. MPSSS team oriented him about the same and on 1st January 2022 he presented a brief report on his learning and shared his experiences with the team.



Millet Fare at KDSS - Khandwa Nutritious yet extinct Millets among Korku tribe were revived by KDSS in the Khandwa diocese. A Millet fare was organized on 23rd December 2021 by the partner organization.



Impact Study of malnourished children at Mandla- A field visit was conducted to the 7 villages of Mandanpur block of Mandla district. Mr. Aneesh Jose and Ms. Natasha Sharma – Lead Program Officers from MPSSS undertook the visit on 14th January 2022.



Awareness Campaign on Malnutrition at Raisen District MPSSS organized awareness campaign on malnutrition from 1st February to 2nd February 2022 at, Raisen district with the support of Misereor and St. Mary Social Work Center. Total 13 villages named Kunda, Amoli, Bhainsa, Jhirpani, Madni, Kirangi, Samasgad, Gorkha, Rampura, Kakaruva, Bijora, Bhaisvaikhurd and Bahisvaikala of Tulsipar block were visited. Open discussions took place with the community members, adolescent girls, youths and other stakeholders of the villages on the issues related to malnutrition. Messages were spread on addressing the issue mainly among the women and children in the visited villages.




